
#### **Two Tracks:**

- 1) Services and Partnerships
- 2) Health Department Systems

\*Health departments can apply for one or both tracks, but must complete both to earn Pathways Recognition THE 10 ESSENTIAL PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES

To protect and promote the health of all people in all communities


The 10 Essential Public Health Services provide a framework for public health to protect and promote the health of all people in all communities. To achieve optimal health for all, the Essential Public Health Services actively promote policies, systems, and services that enable good health and seek to remove obstacles and systemic and structural barriers, such as poverty, racism, gender discrimination, and other forms of oppression, that have resulted in health inequities. Everyone should have a fair and just opportunity to achieve good health and well-being.

# **Program Outline**

#### **Montana Pathways Learning Collaborative**

- Two-year program with monthly virtual calls and 2-3 in-person meetings per year
- Participating health departments receive \$30,000 / year (\$60,000 total)
- Deliverable style task order participating in meetings, draft documentation, other activities
- Cohort-style approach health departments are learning and collaborating with their peers

# **Program Outline**

#### **Montana Pathways Learning Collaborative**

- • 2023 2025 group = 6 health departments (Lincoln, CSKT, Mineral, Beaverhead, Park, and Butte-Silver Bow)
- Facilitated review of the Standards & Measures to identify areas where health departments may need support in order to meet measure requirements
- Using Connected Community to share tools, documents, templates, etc. and promote peer-learning amongst participating health departments

#### **Benefits**

- Identifying training opportunities relevant to MT health departments
- Developing a library of resources
- Leveraging Pathways to build health department capacity to address community needs (e.g., behavioral health)
- Building momentum and confidence among other health departments
- Statewide readiness assessment through PHAB (to provide a state-level report on strengths and oppportunites)
- In progress: using state-level documentation that applies to local and tribal health departments






