Parking at Holiday Inn's lot is free. Take a ticket to enter the lot. The gates will lift. The gates will be open at the end of each day so you can leave without paying. If the gates are down and you need to leave, get a "parking pass" ticket at the hotel's front desk to exit without paying.

Holiday Inn is undergoing a renovation that impacts their parking lot. **Parking is more limited.** Leave ample time to find parking as the lot can only accommodate ~150.

Alternative parking options include ([see map](#)):

- Downtown pay areas:
 - Along Pattee and further north along Main and Front streets
 - Parking garage at the corner of Pattee and Front (one block away)
 - East Front Street Lot - Old Library (two blocks away)
- Downtown free areas:
 - East of Adams St, street parking becomes free.
- **Staying at the DoubleTree Edgewater?**
 - **Holiday Inn Shuttle** will run to and from the Double Tree throughout the entire

conference.

- If you are staying at the Double Tree, you can park at the Double Tree.
 - For pick up and transport to the Conference:
 - Call 406-721-8550 for the Holiday Inn Shuttle pick up.
 - To return from the Double Tree:
 - Just go to the front desk at Holiday Inn.
 - The shuttle will come immediately as long as they are not doing an airport pick up or drop off.
 - Shuttle service ends around 10:00 each night.
- **Walking:** See the map or ask the Double Tree front desk for walking directions. There are two walking options 1) along Front Street and 2) via the River Trail. Both routes are a less than 10 minute walk to Holiday Inn.
